### 2. Putting food on the planning agenda

Thursday 12/10 10.15-11.45 Room: Lönnstorp

**Description**: Food has historically been a forgotten component of urban planning, however, current debates relating to the sustainability, health and climate impacts of our food system have lifted food on the urban agenda. Strategies and policies in city planning are increasingly integrating food questions into the planning discourse, at the same time as many food-related grassroots initiatives emerge across the world. Despite food being commonly accepted as an important part of urban life, planners still struggle to create holistic and integrated approaches to food planning.

The workshop will ask participants to develop a neighbourhood food concept that ensures sustainable, healthy and affordable food for all. In groups, participants will discuss the key challenges facing their neighbourhood, key priorities for planning the food environment, and potential solutions and innovations to address these. The discussions will highlight relevant expertise landscape architects and planners hold that can support the integration of food into urban planning, and highlight examples from SLU research and education.

The group with the best neighbourhood food concept will receive a free copy of the book Landscape Architecture or Woods Go Urban.
