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***Bicycle Workshop***

I want to introduce you to a recently established project—the Ultuna bicycle self-repair workshop—and explore together potentials of how we can develop similar projects to make them subject to, or even an integral part of, our landscape research and teaching.

Background:

What started as a SLU Climate Fund application to establish a volunteer-run bicycle self-repair workshop on the Ultuna campus, is now envisioned to be part of my PhD-research; the idea of a place where people can work and experiment together to develop skills in bicycle maintenance and repair in order to reduce barriers to cycling. My research role is to explore if—and if so, how—engagement with the bicycle as a technology can lead to an enhanced practice of cycling.

The session format:

We will together walk over to the physical bike repair workshop, where I will introduce you to the workshop concept and how I envision it to be part of my research. Together we will then explore and discuss ways to make use of similar projects (campus student gardens, makers spaces, studios, whatever ideas you have) in our respective research and teaching.
