

## Regulations for Ultuna growing club

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Decided at the annual meeting 8 April 2003, updated at annual meeting 12 April 2014

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1. The plots are to be kept tidy so potential weeds will not have time to develop and spread seeds to neighboring plots. A plot also needs to be managed, not left to grow wild. In other case, the Board has the right to exclude the member.
2. Neighboring roads and aisles shall be kept clean and tidy. By aisle, the aisles marked on the map over the growing area are intended. These aisles must be kept at least 80 cm wide. They are, by the grower, to be kept level and free of holes and tufts with the grass mowed, not to be longer than 20 cm. NB! All plots border at least one aisle or road. All growers are obliged to maintain and look after that half of the aisle neighboring their plot.
3. Bushes and other tall plants may not be planted so that it causes inconvenience for the neighbors or causes problems to walk on the aisles.
4. The plot may not be used as storage for other than material annually used on the plot. The plot may not be used as junkyard. The same also holds for aisles or other areas within the growing area.
5. Fences or railings are not allowed. Decision.
6. Pets brought into the area must be kept on a leash.
7. Trees or bushes on or right next to the area may not be cut down or damaged.
8. Stems, tops, sorted weeds and other garden waste which will decompose rapidly, is to be composted or buried at the own plot – or deposited on the common compost, which is cared for and maintained collectively by all growers. Composts may only be constructed so that smell and feeding of wild animals is avoided. Any instructions regarding composting must be followed.
9. Household waste cannot be left in the area but must be brought home (plastic, glass, paper, etc.). This also holds for packing material such as cardboard boxes, plastic bags, empty sacks, pots, etc.
10. Buildings cannot be constructed within the area. Plant support constructions are to be built so that they make a neat impression and do not bother the neighbors. Temporary greenhouses are allowed at a maximum of 1.2 meter and are to be kept tidy.
11. Chemical pesticides and/or insecticides may not be used.
12. Use only healthy seed potatoes, preferably bought and controlled or potatoes grown within the area.
13. Serious pest attacks shall immediately be reported to the board and controlled according to the board's instructions.
14. Cancelled plots are to be dug up and cleaned up before they are returned. Cancellations should be done before end of March. Unless both these points are fulfilled, the member has to pay a penalty which is equal to the annual plot fee. In this way the rent free year given to the new member taking over an overgrown plot are financed.
15. The growing association supplies tools and watering equipment, provided that these are used with care and are cleaned after use.
16. Sprinklers for watering may only be used when the grower is present.
