



Scholarships

- Application deadline has already passed for both the SLU and Swedish Institute scholarship.
- Students granted scholarships have been notified.
- You need to apply to the programme again next year if you cannot pay the tuition fee now.
- No scholarships available after the study start.



Pay the tuition fees

- Students admitted in first admissions round (April) have already paid.
- Students admitted in the second admissions round have to request payment instructions from tuitionfees@slu.se.
- Deadline for students admitted in the second application round is 17 August.
- EU/EEA and Swiss citizens do not have to pay any tuition fees.



Residence permit for higher education

- Residence permit for higher education Swedish Migration Agency.
 www.migrationsverket.se/English
- You must pay the tuition fees before you can apply for a residence permit.
- Process time: 3-5 months.
- Citizens from an EU/EEA country or Switzerland do NOT have to apply for a residence permit.
- Note that SLU cannot affect or have influence on other authorities' decisions.



Conditionally admitted


- Conditions must be fulfilled no later than two weeks after the programme starts (12 September).
- Upload your qualifying degree diploma on www.universityadmissions.se.
- Notify the Admissions Office of SLU, when your diploma is uploaded.

Housing

- Fee-paying students (admitted in April) are guaranteed housing for yourself.
 Note: You need to pay for the housing yourself even if you are guaranteed housing.
- Other students need to arrange housing on their own.

Three parts:

- Part 2: 29 August, Semester starts (mandatory)
- Part 3: 14 september, "Sustainable studies"





Before the study start

- Reply to your offer before 22 July on www.universityadmissions.se (only second admissions round)
- Pay tuition fees & apply for residence permit
- Find housing
- Follow the checklist
- Plan your travel
- Keep yourself updated on "New SLU student"
- Activate your student IT account
- Apply for targeted study support





Orientation week

- 22-26 August. 22-24 = online. 25-26 = on campus
- Information and preparations about studies in Sweden and SLU.
- Recommended, not mandatory.
- Schedule will be updated on New SLU student.
- One registration for all online activities.



Travelling to Sweden


- No travel restrictions due to Covid-19 at the moment.

Random facts about Sweden

- 1,572km from North to South
- The fifth largest country in Europe
- 30 national parks
- 69% covered with trees
- 7% agricultural land
- 3% urban and industrial land
- 10,452,326 million people
- Sami = indigenous people
- 5 official national minorities
- Arabic is the second most spoken language
- 6 June official national day
- Stockholm, Gothenburg, Malmö





Life in Sweden

- Four seasons and different climates and landscapes depending on where you are.
- Very dark vs. very light months
- Fika = Pastry/cookies + coffee/tea
- Biking is an easy and cheap way to get around as a student.
- Joining associations, organisations or clubs = way to get to know Swedes.
- Right of public access (Allemansrätten) = Being out in nature and hiking are common activities.
- Learning Swedish info in checklist





Money, money, money...

- High costs of living minimum SEK 8694 per month (very cheap lifestyle)
- It will be challenging to study and work at the same time in order to cover all expenses.
- Most common to pay with card.
- "I'll swish you"
- Having a Swedish personal identity number will make the process of opening a bank account easier.

- Your monthly student budget 5 5

We've broken it down for you:

Food: SEK 2,000

Accommodation: SEK 4,300

Local travel: SEK 550

Phone/internet: SEK 300

Miscellaneous: SEK 1,544

Total: SEK 8,694

- Usually one course at a time.
- One course can have several examinations.
- Student IT account + access card + Mecenat card app.
- Programme syllabus + Course schedule.
- Canvas = online learning platform.

- Study Guidance + Student Health Services.
- Centre for Academic Language + Library drop-in.
